Simona Maria Francesca Mori, PHD in History of European Society, is full professor of History of Political Institutions at the Department of Literature, Philosophy and Communication of the University of Bergamo (Italy), where she was associate professor in the same discipline since 2007.

She is member of the board of the doctorate course in Mediterranean Studies. History, Law & Economics, at the Lumsa University of Palermo since 2020, and was previously part of the international doctorate course in History and comparison of European political institutions and law at the University of Messina, as well as tutor of an annual junior research grant.

She presently belongs to the scientific or direction committee of three scholarly journals, one of which is first rate for the history of political institutions. She coordinated a research unity in a Research Project of Significant National Interest 2008 and participated in various other financed projects. She is member of the OSAIL Centre, the Observatory of Italian and International Administrative Spaces (University of Napoli "L'Orientale" - University of Trento - LUMSA University Roma).

Due to ministerial appointment, she is presently member of the National Scientific Qualification Commission for the academic subject area of History of political thought and institutions.

Her scientific publications count more than sixty works including two monographic volumes, six edited volumes, articles in qualified historical journals and volume chapters. Her research has been devoted to Italian and European constitutional history from the late 18th Century to the first half of the 20th, and to the history of public administration, with a focus on territorial and local government, as well as on law and order enforcement.
